Urbandale opens the tournament at 7 p.m. Thursday against Columbus of Waterloo. The Sailors, who tied Urbandale with a 7-7 record in the Iowa League season, won the previous three tournaments.

But Urbandale took both regularseason games from the Sailors and last beat them, 6-5, in overtime here Saturday night.

The winner of the Roosevelt-Hoover and Ames playoff meets Metropolitan Conference champion Valley (15-0 in the Metro and 11-3 in the state league) at 9 p.m. Thursday.

Friday night, Iowa League winner Waterloo (12-2) goes against Ankeny (1-12-1) at 7 o'clock and Dowling (11-3) clashes with Sioux City (4-10) at 9.

Opening-round winners meet in the semifinals Saturday night. Firstround losers play Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning.

The championship game begins at 4:30 p.m. Sunday following the consolation game at 2.

Valley, with the highest-scoring forward line and the top goalie during the regular Metro season, is a tourney favorite along with Waterloo and Dowling.

Valley goaltenders, led by freshman Brad Parker, allowed only 1.66 goals a game in the Metro.
