

Sioux City, Ankeny in tourney shutout wins

Ankeny and Sioux City opened the 1980 Iowa High School Hockey Tournament Thursday night with shutout victories at McElroy Auditorium.

Those two teams now advance into second round games Friday night against the top rated teams in the state—Columbus High of Waterloo and Waterloo Public.
