

# Wilson scores 4 to pace Warriors

MASON CITY—Gary Wilson scored four goals to lead the Waterloo Warriors to a 10-3 victory over Sioux City Metro in the Iowa High School Hockey League's state tournament Friday night.

Wilson was the only Warrior to score more than one goal but six other Warriors each scored goals.

Mark Stevens was credited with four assists for the Warriors.

Wilson opened the scoring at 2:24 after Matt Matous and Mark Stevens both had shots stopped by Juha Seipajarvi. Wilson took the second rebound and shot it over Seipajarvi who was sprawled on the ice.

Jim Tyler then scored at 3:11 to give the Warriors a 2-0 lead.

Sioux City was not ready to give in to the strong Warrior team as Mick Emerick scored at 6:12.

Brian Carnes scored the final Warrior goal in the period at 7:10. Ted O'Brien then scored with 57 seconds remaining in the period and Waterloo owned a 3-2 advantage.

In the second period John Jackson and Brian Cook each scored for the Warriors while Sioux City hit the net only once.

Seipajarvi, a foreign exchange student from Finland, kept Sioux City in the game as he was forced to stop 15 Warrior shots.

Wilson scored his second goal at 1:09 of the third period while the Warriors were skating short-handed.

Wilson and his brother, Ed, teamed up to put the Warriors on the board again 25 seconds later. Gary passed the puck in front of the net to Ed, who shot the puck into the goal.

From then on the Warriors were able to dominate the game. Gary Wilson scored two more goals while Doug Dietz tallied once.

"We got two quick goals and then we became very lackadaisical," said Warriors Coach Dave Swick. "We learned what the playoffs are all about tonight. A hot goaltender and a team that wouldn't quit showed us we would have to play for 45 minutes—we can't let up."

In other games, Des Moines public defeated host Mason City 7-4 while Valley of West Des Moines edged out Ames 4-3.

In the consolation bracket Ames defeated Dubuque 8-3 and Urbandale downed Dowling 9-6.
