The high school team will take its best regular-season record ever into the state tournament, set for today, Saturday and Sunday at Waterloo's McElroy Auditorium.

The Mohawks were 11-9 overall and 9-7 in Iowa High School Hockey League play, good for a third-place tie with Ames, Urbandale and West Des Moines Valley-Dowling.

Mason City's first-round opponent at 2 p.m. today is Ames. In regular-season action, Mason City posted 1-0 and 2-1 victories.

'I think if we win our first game, we have a good chance at the said Mason City championship. coach John Llovd.

He said that despite knowing Des Moines Public, the regular-season champ, would be the Mohawks' likely second-round opponent at 8 p.m. Saturday should both schools win their openers

"They (Des Moines) beat us twice but the thing is I know we won't have any trouble getting up for them," said Lloyd

Ames "is a well balanced team, very young, but very fast. We'll be on a small rink, though, and if we hustle back and plug things up, we can beat them.

Lloyd said his club is injury free but "we're worried about sickness. We've had a number of players with colds and flu this week but none will be out Friday I hope. It's taken its toll in practice but today we had one of our best practices of the season.

The Mohawks are led by goaltender John Rosenfeld, one of the best in the league; David Despenas, team point leader with 20 on 13 goals and seven assists; Eric Held, with 19 points; and Dana Despenas, with 18 points.
