Swanson provided the game-winning goal when he pushed the puck past Valley-Dowling goaltender Eric Gibson with just one second remain-

ing in the first period. It was Swanson's third goal of the season and 17th point. Mike Swartzel and Brian Burke had assists on the

game's lone goal. In afternoon games Friday, regular-season scoring champion Marc Gillard collected a hat trick in sparking Waterloo Public to an 8-2 victory over defending state champion Ames. then Brian Wehr, the second-leading scorer in the prep league, broke loose for a hat trick as Waterloo Columbus waltzed by Urbandale 9-3.

Sioux City's Patrick recorded his third shutout of the season in turning back 16 shots.

Although Sioux City's pestering defense limited Valley-Dowling to just 16 shots. Patrick had to come up with several big saves on what appeared to be potential red-lighters at the moment of launch.

Valley-Dowling's last gasp came with just over a minute remaining when Patrick, a junior at East High School, was left face-to-face with a Figer forward 10 feet directly in front

Sioux City's Patrick, who also competes in football and track at East High, is hoping for a strong senior season. "My goal is to either make a college team or a Junior "A' team after next year," said the Metro goalie, who has been in goal for all of Sioux City's games this season.

'I'm going to try my best to make the Musketeers team," continued Patrick. "Not very many Sioux City kids have played for the Musketeers. but I'd like to give it a try," said the 17-year-old, whose brother, Craig, is a goaltender and plays club hockey at Cal State-Fullerton.
