SIOUX CITY - For three straight vears. Columbus of Waterloo went winless at the state high school hockey tour-

Five years have passed since the Sailors, once the dominant team in Iowa prep hockey, played for the state tournament championship.

But all that ended here Saturday afternoon as Columbus turned back its toughest rival - the

Waterloo Warriors - for a 2-1 semifinal-round overtime victory and a date this afternoon at 3:30 against Mason City for the title. The Mohawks advanced on the strength of a 3-0 shutout of host Sioux City.

Columbus owned a 2-1 advantage over Mason City in the regular-season series and led the third game before it got away.

Saturday, strong defense and brilliant goaltending by senior Pat Lanigan (35 saves) carried Columbus to its third win in four meetings with the Warriors this season. And, in a defensive struggle, it was fitting that defenseman Craig Becker should score the game-winner 1:37 into the extra period.

After a scoreless first period, the Warriors grabbed a 1-0 lead on
