

Warriors tumble, 4-1; Sioux City in finals

SIoux CITY — Hockey at sun-up didn't dawn bright for Waterloo as the Warriors dropped a 4-1 consolation round game to Dubuque at the Iowa High School Hockey League state tournament Saturday morning.

Knocked into the loser's bracket by a 6-2 setback to host and defending champion Sioux City Friday afternoon, the Warriors took the ice at 7 a.m. here Saturday and never got the wakeup call.

Dubuque's top line of Aaron Cigrand, Keith Kester and Ben Roth produced a goal late in the second period to break a scoreless struggle, then the Devils tacked on three more scores in the third period to break it open. Kester scored two of those and Cigrand the other.

Waterloo got on the board with 14 seconds to play when Brett Klima scored. His shot was just the 20th on goal by the Warriors, who played at 7 a.m. again this morning for seventh place.
