## Mohawks shine in 6-2 win

**MASON CITY** — In the final game on home ice this season, Mason City Hockey Club's four representatives in the Iowa High School Hockey League All-Star Game made it a memorable one.

The Mohawks' Ramyleo AbuJobarah, Jerry Springer, Ben Klocke and Jake Sorensen helped the Eastern Division All-Stars skate to a 6-2 victory over the Western Division All-Stars.

"People were telling me before the game that this would be the last time I would play at this arena," Springer, a senior forward, said. "So it felt really good to finish with a win."

"It's great to go out with a win," Sorensen said. "We're lucky to have it here. The crowd was great. It was a fun game."

Mason City returns to action again March 9-12 in Sioux City for the IHSHL state tournament.

"When we go to state," Klocke said, "we plan on win-

ning it."

"We know we can beat every team," Sorensen said. "We have beaten every team. If we just play together as a team, and pull together, we should be able to contend."

AbuJobarah, a senior goaltender, started in goal for the Western All-Stars.

In the first period, AbuJobarah stopped 18 shots, including nine consecutive shots midway through the period before the Eastern All-Stars could clear the puck out of the zone. He also stopped a breakaway attempt early in the period.

"I thought he was going to cut across in front," he said about the breakaway, "but he came back the other way so I laid back my glove and kind of got lucky."

The Mohawks Springer began the scoring with a goal at 4:37 by Omaha Gladiators' goalie Nate Weiler.

"It was a 3-on-1," Springer said. "A guy on my line shot and I rebounded and I shot it in the net."
