"We're feeling good," senior defenseman Will Price said. "We knew it was going to be tough, but we feel good after this one and we need to be ready to go for (today)."

Last season, the Mohawks lost 5-2 to the Metros in a first-round game to the Metros at Sioux City. Mason City was called for 33 penalty minutes in the loss.

The Mohawks overcame the penalty problems Friday by getting good looks at the goal and converting on power-play opportunities.

"We did adjust," Mason City coach John Lloyd said, "and things turned out better. We were still getting some pretty good shots. But we scored some goals (Friday), which we're not noted for."

Sioux City took a 1-0 lead midway through the first period on a short-handed goal by Ben Deck, who led the IHSHL with 48 points during the regular season.

Mason City tied the game when Matt Paulsen knocked the loose puck by Metros' goalie Ryan Dohrmann, Kyle Huff and Robbie Springer assisted Paulsen on his 11th goal of the season.

The Mohawks would take a 3-1 lead in the second period with goals from Jake Sorensen and Bret Slife.

Sorensen, who normally plays defense but played at the wing position Friday, skated into the Sioux City zone and fired a slap shot by Dohrmann for his 12th goal this season.

Slife's goal, which was the game-winner, was his third of the season.

"Jake really drilled his shot," Lloyd said, "He got it off so quick. That was the main thing.

"We were going to the net to get most of our goals. There were a lot of scrambles in front of the net where the puck was still loose," he added.

Sioux City's Brian Swanson scored a power-play goal at 10:35 in the second period to cut into the Mohawks' lead.

Fox scored his 10th goal of the season and Brian Schloemer added his 11th as the Mohawks pulled away in the third period.

The loss drops Sioux City into the consolation bracket where the Metros face Dubuque today at 11:15 a.m.

Mason City faces the Omaha Junior Lancers for a trip to the championship

The Mohawks lost it two final regular season games to the Junior Lancers on Feb. 24 and 25. Omaha won those games 5-1 and 2-1.

"We have to stay out of the (penalty) box if we want to win again (today)," Price said. "That was the worst thing we did. I think our fore check is going real good and if we keep that up, we should be all right.

"It will be a good game. Those guys (Junior Lancers) are good," he added.
