Omaha claims state title, 1-0

MASON CITY — Marc Rood carried the Omaha Junior Lancers again.

Rood stopped 15 shots and recorded his second consecutive shutout as Omaha defeated the Des Moines Capitals 1– 0 for the Iowa High School Hockey League state championship Sunday at the North Iowa Ice Arena.

It was the first championship for Omaha since 1996. The Junior Lancers also won in 1995 and finished second in 1997 and 1998.

Rood, who had 27 saves in a 4-0 victory over Mason City Saturday, earned the state tournament Most Valuable Player.

"The team just played incredible in front of me," Rood said. "They helped me out all weekend. They scored the goals and I stopped the shots. It just works out like that and we won.

"I felt I was in the game and the team was in the game and we were all pumped to play this weekend. It's unbelievable. It's awesome."

Rood becomes the first Junior Lancer to win the tournament MVP since Tom Ogee in 1996. Robert Pullum also earned MVP honors in 1995.

"I couldn't have won it without this team," Rood said. "They're awesome."

Kyle Greer scored the games only goal at 5:06 in the first period.

Greer slipped the puck under the left leg of Des Moines goalie Ben Boulden, who made 26 saves, for the unassisted, game-winning goal.

"This feels very good," firstyear Omaha coach Chuck Nano said. "I knew I had the team to do it when the year

began. I never had any doubts. I'm very proud of the boys. They did an excellent iob."

While the victory was sweet for Nano, he said the game would have been more comfortable with a bigger goal margin.

"I had a lot of confidence in my goaltender and I knew he was going to be tough to beat," he said. "We just pretty much put it all on him and he got the iob done."
