## Warriors ice Oak Leafs, to play for title

## Warriors to play Kansas City today in championship.

AMES - Connor Hyde took his coaches' advice and it paid off as he put back a pair of rebounds to give the Waterloo Warriors their first two goals in a 3-1 win over Des Moines Oak Leafs Saturday in the Midwest High School Hockey League tournament semifinals

The Warriors (33-1-0) will face Kansas City noon today in Ames for the MHSHI title.



Hyde scored

Waterloo's opening goal by putting back a deflection in the middle slot 5 minutes, 15 seconds into the first period, Des Moines tied the game on Mark Alexander's score 8:54 into the second period. Twenty-eight seconds later, Hyde found himself in position to put back another rebound, which gave Waterloo the lead for good.

"We talked about things all year long with kids keeping their sticks down when they get into the offensive zone and thank goodness he listens," Waterloo Warriors' coach Doug Dietz said of Hyde's go-ahead goal. "A shot came, he had his stick down and he wasted no time. The puck touched his stick and it was in the net."

After Des Moines (24-7-2) scored the equalizing goal, Dietz was pleased with the way his team responded. Chance Kremer finished with 18 saves to pick up his 33rd win over a MHSHL opponent.

Jake Lichty iced the game for the Warriors with an empty net goal with 13 seconds remaining.

"Des Moines comes in ready to play," Dietz said "We know what's at stake just as much as everybody

else and we played hard We had a little letdown in the second period. I think we were willing this thing to win instead of just playing our game.
