Regis has scored 26 goals in the tournament to the Warriors 30, but the Warriors have surrendered 12 goals

and Regis has only allowed five pucks to cross the crease

"They are a lot like us," Warriors coach Doug Dietz said. "They keep things simple and get the puck to the net."

The Warriors needed a goal in the final eight seconds to defeat the Pioneers in an earlier round robin

There was no dramatic finish in the rematch as the Warriors jumped to a 6-0 lead mid way through the second period, then finished off the Pioneers with the final four goals, sending them packing back to Arizona.
