Austin Jackson was there for the rebound, and the Warriors' scoring leader found the back of the net for the winner in a thrilling 4-3 Waterloo victory.

"I don't believe we played our best hockey today," Warriors coach Doug Dietz said. "But like I told the guys after the game. 'Championship teams find a way to win? and they did that today."

Dietz added, "They need to understand that they are playing in a national championship tournament and not to take anyone too lightly."

The Warriors won their first round match, 12-1, Thursday against the Washington Hornets.

"Teams will not lay down for us and we need guys to step up," said Dietz. "Today was a wake up call."
