QC Blues on hold as well

After the latest word from Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds regarding a new COVID-19 proclamation, the Midwest High School Hockey League has been placed in a pause.

"After league officials contacted the governor's office, it was confirmed that the proclamation considers the league to be recreational and is therefore prohibited from gathering," league officials said in a news release sent Thursday. "The proclamation, starting on Tuesday,

Nov. 17, will end at midnight Thursday, Dec. 10."

With that decision made, the MHSHL has scratched all games scheduled between now and Dec. 10. Practice is also paused for all Iowa teams during this period, including the Quad City Blues.

"Hopefully the League can resume play Dec. 11," the release said, "and follow the current schedule, concluding with the year-end varsity and junior varsity tournaments in Ames March 4-7."
